General Information

Welcome to the Judiciary of Guam's Adult Drug Court program. This brochure is designed to answer questions, address concerns and provide overall information about the Adult Drug Court program. As a participant, you will be expected to follow the instructions given to you by the Judge, probation officer, and case manager as well as comply with the treatment requirements as developed by the Adult Drug Court Team. The following information will give you a general idea of what will be expected of you as an Adult Drug Court participant.



ABOUT ADULT DRUG COURTS.

An Adult Drug Court is a court that has been specifically designated and staffed to supervise non-violent adult drug offenders who have been found to be legally and clinically eligible to participate in a comprehensive and judicially monitored program of drug treatment and rehabilitation services.

Drug Courts represent a very non-traditional approach to adult drug offenders who have been identified as moderate to heavy substance abusers. Drug Courts are built upon a unique partnership between the criminal justice system and the drug treatment community, one which structures treatment around the authority and personal involvement of a single Drug Court Judge. Drug Courts are also dependent upon the creation of a non-adversarial courtroom atmosphere where a single judge and a dedicated team work together toward a common goal of breaking the cycle of drug abuse and criminal behavior.

Guam's Adult Drug Court is a voluntary program that fast tracks first time drug offenders to efficiently deliver rehabilitative treatment in a judicially supervised program using sanctions and incentives. If an individual qualifies for the Adult Drug Court Program he/she will

plead guilty to the drug offense. The Court however, defers acceptance of the guilty plea and the individual will immediately enter a drug or alcohol treatment program which must be completed within 2 years. Failure to successfully complete the program will result in a felony drug conviction and up to three years confinement at the Department of Corrections.



The Program is a four-phased intense, comprehensive, strength-based approach to substance abuse treatment that includes the following interventions:

- Ongoing assessment services
- Orientation and Psycho-Educational Groups
- Individual, Family and Group Counseling
- Recreational therapy and treatment intervention
- Urinalysis testing, Saliva testing and Alcohol testing
- Educational / Vocational / Employment / Referrals
- Life skills program
- Sanctions and incentives, and
- Staffing / Weekly Court Hearings with the ADC Judge
